## Your Gateway to Mobile Computing Solutions



### Break Free of the Manufacturer-Centric Mobile World

There remain many companies in the mobile marketplace who continue to use older, DOS-based terminals that are matched with custom-made printers. An example of this is the Intermec 62XX terminal that only prints to the Intermec 48XX and 68XX printers. Newer developments in the mobile printing market give these users much more flexibility when they upgrade. The advent of portable, mobile printing allows these users to break free of being locked into a single manufacturer for their system needs. Four-inch, thermal printers such as the Zebra QLXXX and RWXXX, the Oneil MicroFlash 4T and the Printek FieldPro provide flexibility and are handheld independent. Any Bluetooth or 802.11-enabled handheld can communicate with these printers. This means an Intermec 7XX computer can print to a Printek FieldPro printer or any other Bluetooth printer. ISG takes this flexibility to the next step by offering custom system changes that make it even easier to reduce costs and make good use of your mobile equipment investment.

-  If you have older handhelds (Windows Mobile or PocketPC) that are not Bluetooth-enabled, ISG can install Bluetooth modules, making them wireless. You will now be able to print to any Bluetooth printer. If you prefer, ISG can convert these handhelds to 802.11-enabled as well.
-  If you have older Intermec printers (48XX or 68XX), you don't have to replace them if you are upgrading your handhelds. ISG can retrofit the printers with new docks that work with the new Intermec 7XX, CKXX and CNX lines (as well as other manufacturers' handhelds).
-  ISG can provide custom cables that allow DOS-based terminals to print to mobile printers through a serial port.
-  ISG can install wide-area, wireless radios in most Windows Mobile handhelds, converting them into real-time data devices.

### Bluetooth Evolution

Bluetooth communications have been around for a few years now in many handheld devices and printers. Bluetooth allows two devices (both containing a Bluetooth radio) to connect to each other (aka "Pair") and exchange data. The most commonly used application for this communication is printing. After a handheld and a printer have been paired, the handheld can send print files to a printer, wirelessly from up to 10 meters / 30 feet away. This increases productivity for personnel in the field by reducing the amount of time spent to fiddle with wires or docks. A major downside in early devices containing Bluetooth capabilities was the 30 foot maximum range (Classified as Class 2 Bluetooth). Drivers would need to be close enough to their Bluetooth-enabled printers in order for them to print out their invoices. With that problem in hand, some of the newer handhelds now contain Class 1 Bluetooth modules. This allows for communication between devices of up to 100 meters / 300 feet away. Intermec CK61 and Intermec PB50 are perfect examples of devices that contain the extended range Bluetooth capability.
